## THE 2024 ROBIN ALEXANDER TRIAL



## SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

- 1. CAMEL VALE MOTOR CLUB will organise a Clubmans Permit Sporting Trial on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2024 at Penvose Farm, St Tudy, Cornwall. PL30 3NP Map Ref 200 / 058779. What3Words: silence.contain.according
- 2. The meeting will be held under The General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations.
- 3. Motorsport UK Permit has been applied for.
- 4. The event is a qualifying round of the 2024 MSUK, BTRDA, ASWMC Sporting Trial and BTRDA Allrounders Championships The event is open to fully elected members of the organising club, BTRDA, NPTCC and any motor club affiliated to the ASWMC.
- 5. All drivers and passengers must produce a valid Club Membership Card, Competition Licence and Championship registration card, if applicable. Camel Vale Motor Club can offer lifetime passenger membership for £1, available at signing on.
- 6. The programme of the meeting will be:

Scrutineering starts at 9.30am
Any competitor not signed on by 10:45am may be excluded.
First car starts 11:00am

- 7. Public roads will not be used to link sections. There will be at least 24 sections on private land. Details of the sections will be issued at signing on. The entry will be split into groups starting at different hills.
- 8. The event will consist of three classes as follows:
  - 1. RED category driver Independent Suspension as per BTRDA listings
  - 2. RED category driver Live Axle Car as per BTRDA listings
  - 3. BLUE category driver Independent Suspension as per BTRDA listings
  - 4. BLUE category driver Live Axle Car as per BTRDA listings
  - 5. Rookie driver as per BTRDA listings
  - 6. Any non-BTRDA classified driver, a car not sealed to the BTRDA differential rules or running any previously listed MSUK tyre. Drivers are not eligible for the Robin Alexander Trophy or for points to the Camel Vale Brewer Cup
- All vehicles must comply with Motorsport UK Technical Regulations. All vehicles
  must have effective silencing. Any vehicle deemed to be too noisy by the scrutineer,
  will not be allowed to start.
- 10. All Championship contending vehicles must comply with BTRDA / Motorsport UK tyre regulations.

11. Awards will be presented as follows: (No competitor may win more than one award)

Overall Winner - Robin AlexanderTrophy (to be held for 11 months) & replica Winner of other classes - Saab Mewton Trophy (held for 11 months) & replica Class Win Award (Subject to 3 starters in Class) except major class winners Second in Class Award (Subject to 5 starters in Class)
Third in Class Award (Subject to 9 starters in Class)

Points will be earned by Camle Vale members for the Camel Vale Car Trophy, Brewer Cup, Under-21 Trophy and Brian Rabey Trophy to be awarded annually.

- 12. The entry list opens on receipt of these regulations, closes provisionally on Saturday 24th August 2024 and closes finally at 10:00am on the day of the event. **The entry fee is £40.00 with a reduction to £35.00 for entries received by the provisional closing date.** All entries should be made on-line with payment of the appropriate fee, using the Camel Vale Motor Club website: www.camelvalemotorclub.co.uk
