

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

CVMC Production Car Autotest – Sunday 1 September 2024

1. Announcement

Camel Vale Motor Club Limited will organise a grass field Clubmans Production Car Autotest on Sunday 1 September 2024 at Burner Farm, Wadebridge, PL27 6EH OS 200 - 989737

2. Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations.

3. Permit

Motorsport UK Permit No: TBC

4. Eligibility

The event is open to all fully elected junior members and competition novices of the organising club, as well as members of Holsworthy Motor Club, Launceston & North Cornwall Motor Club, Newquay Auto Club, North Devon Motor Club, Plymouth Motor Club, South Hams Motor Club, Truro

& District Motor Club, Windwhistle Motor Club, Woolbridge Motor Club and the MG Car Club. Competitors are required to produce their club membership card together with their Motorsport UK

Competition Licence (RS Clubmans as a minimum) at signing on.

5. Club Trophies

Competitors who are Camel Vale Motor Club members will score points towards the following trophies:

South West Sweepers Autotest Trophy

Under 21 Trophy

Car Trophy

Brian Rabey Electrical Trophy

6. Event Programme

The programme of the meeting will be:

Signing on 11:00 hrs

Scrutineering 11:00 hrs

Drivers briefing 11:30 hrs

Competition commences shortly thereafter

Any competitor not signed on by 11:15 hrs may be excluded.

Competitors will be given the opportunity to walk the course prior to competing.

7. Classes

The event classes are:

CLASS A. Production cars up to 2,000cc; front engine rear wheel drive

CLASS B. Production cars up to 2,000cc; engine over driven wheels

All cars must comply with the current Motorsport UK vehicle and tyre regulations.

M&S marked tyres are allowed provided they are a standard road tyre with no snow symbols on them. Note the following types of tyre are not permitted: Off road; Grip; Winter; Cross Climate; All-Season. Knobbly type tyres are not permitted. The Club reserves the right to refuse the use of any tyre considered to be too aggressive to protect the future use of the venue.

Cars with Fiddle brakes or LSD will have a 20% penalty imposed.

Minimum age for competitors is 14 years.

Any competitor who does not hold a full RTA Licence may only drive a Touring Car (per Motorsport

UK Yearbook definition) with a maximum engine capacity of 2000cc including forced induction. As the event takes place wholly on private property, vehicles need not be taxed or registered.

8. Event Description

The event will consist of 6 tests and competitors will attempt each test 4 times subject to any time

constraints. A maximum of three tests will be running at any one time. All timed runs will count towards results. Details of the tests and any final instructions will be issued at signing on.

Timing will be by marshal's handheld stopwatch. Timing will commence on verbal instruction of the

marshal at the start of the test.

All competition cars must carry one passenger who holds a full RTA licence and a Motorsport UK

Competition Licence (RS Clubmans as a minimum) and be experienced in Autotests or AutoSOLOs.

Properly fastened seatbelts must be worn by both driver and passenger.

Please note: Practicing is not permitted.

9. Identification

Cars will be identified by numbers supplied by the organisers.

10. Penalties

Penalties will be imposed as follows:

- Wrong test - maximum score per test (fastest time in class plus 20 seconds)
- Hitting cone/marker - 5 seconds added
- Finish astride - time keeps ticking until the vehicle is stopped astride the finish line. Marshal will advise when you are astride.

11. Awards

Awards will be presented as follows:

Overall winner Major award and replica

1st in each Class subject to 3 starters

2nd in each Class subject to 5 starters

3rd in each Class subject to 9 starters

No competitor may win more than one award.

Awards will be presented at the Camel Vale Motor Club awards evening in early 2025.

12. Entries

The maximum entry for the meeting is 30 and the minimum is 6. Should the minimum amount of

entries not be reached 48hrs prior to the event, the organisers have the right to cancel.

Classes

may be amalgamated or sub-divided at the organiser's discretion. Cars may be double driven.

Entries open on publication of these SRs and are accepted at the organiser's discretion.

The entry fee is **£30**, with a reduction to £25 for entries received at least 7 days prior to the event.

All entries must be made using the online entry form available on the club website

www.camelvalemotorclub.co.uk.

Any entry received from a competitor who is under the age of 18 will require parental consent.

Entry fees will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is given in writing to the event secretary 48hrs

prior to the event. All refunds will be subject to an administration fee of £5.
