THE 2025 TREMAYLE TESTING TRIAL

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. Announcement

Camel Vale Motor Club Limited will organise a grass field Clubmans Autotest and Production Car Autotest (PCA) on Sunday 28 September 2025 at Tremayle Farm, Nanstallon, Bodmin PL30 5JY.

2. Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport UK (ASN) (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations.

3. Permit

ASN Autotest Permit No: 204502

ASN PCA Permit No: 204501

4. Eligibility

The event is open to fully elected members of the organising club, as well as members of Holsworthy Motor Club, Launceston & North Cornwall Motor Club, the MCC, North Devon Motor Club and Plymouth Motor Club.

Competitors and passengers are required to produce their club membership card together with their ASN Competition Licence (RS Clubmans as a minimum) at signing on. Any competitor under the age of 18 will require parental consent.

Autotest: Competitors of at least 16 years are eligible to enter. Passengers are not permitted.

PCA: Competitors of at least 14 years of age are eligible to enter. All competing vehicles must carry one passenger who holds a full RTA licence, an ASN Competition Licence and be experienced in Autotests or AutoSOLOs.

5. Event Programme

The programme of the meeting will be:

Signing on	09:30 hrs
Scrutineering	09:30 hrs
Drivers briefing	10:30 hrs
Competition commences shortly thereafter	

Any competitor not signed on by 10:15 hrs may be disqualified.

6. Classes

The event classes are:

CLASS 1.	Autotest	Closed cars
CLASS 2.	Autotest	Open cars
CLASS 3.	Autotest	Non-production cars
CLASS 4.	PCA	Closed cars
CLASS 5.	PCA	Open cars

All vehicles must comply with current ASN vehicle and tyre regulations.

As the event takes place wholly on private property, vehicles need not be taxed or registered.

All vehicles must have effective silencing. Any vehicle considered by the scrutineer to be too noisy will not be allowed to start.

Any competitor who does not hold a full RTA Licence may only drive a Touring Car (per NCR Ch. 1 App. 1 definition) with a maximum engine capacity of 1400cc and without forced induction (Autotest) or with a maximum engine capacity of 2000cc including forced induction (PCA).

7. Event Description

The event will consist of a number of short time tests over a series of marked out sections on grass.

Timing will be by marshal's handheld stopwatch. Timing will commence on verbal instruction of the marshal at the start of the test. Timing will conclude when the competing vehicle is stopped astride the finish line.

Results will be calculated using the total time taken to complete all the tests. The best performance will be the competitor with the lowest score.

Penalties will be imposed in accordance with NCR Ch. 19 App. 9 penalty table, including:

- Incorrect route taken/wrong test – maximum score (fastest time in class plus 20 seconds)
- Hitting section marker or failing to stop astride – 5 seconds per incident

Details of the sections and any final instructions will be issued at signing on.

Please note: Practising with a vehicle is not permitted, however competitors are able to walk the sections prior to competing should they wish.

8. Identification

Vehicles will be identified by numbers supplied by the organisers.

9. Awards

Awards will be presented as follows:

Overall winner	A trophy
Class win in each Class	subject to 3 starters
2nd in each Class	subject to 5 starters
3rd in each Class	subject to 9 starters

No competitor may win more than one award.

Awards will be presented at the Camel Vale Motor Club awards evening in early 2026.

10. Entries

The maximum entry for the meeting is 30 and the minimum is 6. The minimum for each class is 3. Should the minimum number of entries not be reached 48hrs prior to the event, the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate the classes as necessary.

Vehicles may be double driven.

Entries open on publication of these SRs and will close finally on Friday 26 September 2025. All entries are accepted at the organiser's discretion.

The entry fees are: Adult: £25
 Under 16: £15

All entries must be made using the online entry form available on the club website www.camelvalemotorclub.co.uk.

Entry fees will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is given in writing to the event secretary 48hrs prior to the event. All refunds will be subject to an administration fee of £5.
